#### **What Makes Satcha Café Special**

Satcha Café sits at the heart of the Satcha Handicraft Center, offering authentic Cambodian cuisine amidst traditional artisan workshops. Opened in 2022, it's now a must-visit destination for travelers seeking a genuine cultural experience with their meal.

The café provides a calm atmosphere away from the busy tourist areas, with plants hanging from wooden beams and handcrafted tables made by local artisans.

#### What Sets This Place Apart:

- Food made with locally sourced ingredients from nearby farms
- Seating areas that allow you to watch craft-making in progress
- A menu that tells the cultural story behind each dish
- Walls adorned with locally crafted art available for purchase



#### **Signature Dishes**

The menu at Satcha Café changes with the seasons, but these fan favorites are always available:

#### Fish Amok

A creamy curry steamed in banana leaves, considered Cambodia's national dish

#### Khmer Noodle Soup

Rice noodles in a clear, aromatic broth with fresh herbs

#### **Beef Lok Lak**

Stir-fried beef served with a lime-pepper dipping sauce

#### Mango Sticky Rice

Sweet dessert with fresh mango and coconut milk

# Kampot Pepper Crab

Seafood dish featuring the famous Kampot pepper

#### **Must-Try Drinks**

- Cambodian iced coffee with sweetened milk
- Fresh-pressed sugar cane juice
- Coconut water served in the shell
- Herbal teas made from local plants

#### More Than Just a Meal

Your time at Satcha Café can include more than eating. The café connects to the larger Handicraft Center with activities throughout the day:

- \* Free guided tours at 10 AM and 2 PM daily
- Craft demonstrations showing traditional techniques
- Hands-on workshops (additional cost applies)
- Cultural shows during evening meals

In 2024, Satcha Café partnered with the TUI Care Foundation to host approximately 50 special dinner events annually, featuring Cambodian boxing, traditional dance, and puppet performances.

## Morning (8-10 AM)

- See artisans start their daily work
- Enjoy a quiet breakfast
- Beat the midday heat

## Lunchtime (12-2 PM)

- Watch craft demonstrations
- Try the daily special

## Meet other tourists

- Evening (5-7 PM) • See the handicraft center in soft lighting
- Book a private dinner with cultural shows
- Shop when crowds are smaller

## **How to Get There**

Satcha Café is located about 2 km from the Old Market area of Siem Reap. You can reach it several ways:

#### Tuk-tuk & Bicycle \$3-5 each way from downtown 15-minute ride from Pub Street ★ Walking Tour Van Many tour companies include 25-30 minutes from city center it

**Tip:** If using a map app, search for "Satcha Handicraft Center" as some maps don't show the café by name yet.

When you eat at Satcha Café, your money supports local development. The café creates jobs and funds training for craft workers through the center.

## **Current Impact**

- Works with more than 50 local artisans
- Supports 15 different traditional craft types
- Provides fair wages to all employees
- Uses locally sourced ingredients from nearby farms

## **Future Goals**

Up to 200 more local artisans will receive training in the next three years thanks to funding from the café and other parts of the Satcha Handicraft Center.
